Progress Reports have been shared and PJP is hosting virtual Parent-Teacher-Student conferences on Wednesday, December 20th from 5:30 - 7:30 PM. These conferences are virtual appointments over zoom and students are welcome and encouraged to join in the conversation. 
Here are some ideas for students to make the most of Progress Reports:

Guidance Office

FASFA-Opens December 31, 2023

If you are applying for financial aid for college, the Department of Education has announced the 2024-2025 FAFSA will be available by December 31, 2023.

In the meantime, you can create your FSA ID ... don't wait to do this because it can take a number of days for the Department of Education to verify your information. Dependent students will need an FSA ID for one or both of their parents as well. All students and contributors (such as parents and spouses) must create an FSA Account—even if the contributor does not have a Social Security number. The FSA ID (account username and password) allows students and parents to identify themselves electronically to access, complete, sign, and submit a FAFSA form. If you don't already have an FSA ID, go to: studentaid.gov/fsa-id/create-account/launch to create an FSA ID now.

Parents: If you previously created an FSA ID, you don't need to create another one. You can only have one FSA ID linked to your Social Security number. However, if you don't remember your username, select "Forgot Username." If you verified your email address or mobile phone number during account creation, you may enter your email address or mobile phone number instead of your username. If you forgot your password, select "Forgot Password," and follow prompts to reset your password.

Additionally, as you wait for FAFSA to open, you can visit and utilize the Federal Student Aid Estimator, which provides an estimate of how much federal student aid you may be eligible to receive. These estimates are based on the Student Aid Index (SAI), used to determine federal student aid eligibility.

SENIORS-College Acceptances and Scholarship & Grant Awards Please Submit to the Guidance Office

As seniors begin to receive college acceptances and scholarships & grant awards, please have your senior submit this good news to the Guidance Office! They can either make a copy of the acceptances or financial awards and drop it off to Mrs. Bell, Guidance Office Administrative Assistant, or they can take a screenshot / picture of it and email it to her at dbell@pjphs.org.
