

As the year winds down, a reminder to make sure our students finish strong. We are working hard to help all students complete the necessary assignments and tasks to prevent the need to attend summer school. We


encourage anyone in need of help to reach out to their teachers or Mr. Rogers and his staff in the PLC.

Academic Affairs



Due to the global outage of Bluebook, the CollegeBoard has provided a new testing date for AP Psychology. This test is scheduled for Wednesday, May 28th at 8 a.m. Senior students in Ms. DiGiorgio's Anatomy class who are also enrolled in AP Psychology will take the Anatomy exam during the conflict period on Friday, May 30th at 2nd period.



Final exams begin for seniors this week on Tuesday, May 27. Seniors are expected to be dressed in full uniform and should report to school only when they have an exam scheduled. All other students in grades 9-11 will be in class following the regular schedule.

UNDERCLASS Exams will be taken on June 5, 6, and 9th. To protect the academic integrity of exams, NO STUDENTS may take any exams early. If any students are absent from school during the exam period and miss exams, they must take their exams when they return. Late exams will cause incomplete grades on the student's report card. Class rank for students with incomplete grades will not be calculated properly. While GPA will be adjusted as soon as the corrected report card is issued, Class Rank is only updated when S1 and Year-end report cards are issued and will be corrected at the end of the 1st semester of the 2025-2026 Academic Year.

Blue and Gold Day

Blue and Gold Day, Wednesday, May 21st, is quickly approaching. Homerooms will be competing throughout the day starting and ending with a Pep Rally in the gym. Because of the nature of the competition in which they will be participating, students will be permitted to dress down. The dress code rules for this day are different from any other day. Please read the following dress code regulations carefully. TEN POINTS WILL BE AWARDED TO EACH HOMEROOM IF EVERYONE COMPLIES! Members of the BLUE TEAM must wear a BLUE T-shirt and GOLD TEAM members must wear a GOLD/YELLOW T-shirt. The shirts must have sleeves and they may be decorated to show your SCHOOL SPIRIT. Please avoid any inappropriate sayings or slogans. FOR BLUE AND GOLD DAY ONLY-sweatpants, yoga pants/leggings, or athletic shorts/gym shorts may be worn. (They will not be permitted on future dress down days.) Athletic shorts must be as long as your fingertips when you hold your hands down by your side, and they should not have any writing on the back. Athletic shoes will suit you best for competition. All clothing must be whole—not ripped or torn.

The day will be warm and sunny, so don't forget your sunscreen. You may wear face paint on your cheeks only. Remember, the day will be warm and sunny, so think about whether painting your face is a good idea.

Medication Pick Up

If your PJP student has any medication stored in the nurse's office, please make arrangements with us at nurse@pjphs.org for pick-up prior to your student's last day. There is no nurse available for pick up once the school year ends, and storing meds for the summer is not permitted.

- EpiPens, Inhalers, and Diabetes Supplies can be taken home by students.
- Daily or 'as needed' medications must be picked up by a parent/guardian.

Rising Seniors

Dose 2 of MCV is required by PA Immunization Law for attendance in 12th grade. Students who have not completed this obligation will not receive a parking pass and will be excluded from school after day 5 of senior year. Medically signed waivers are accepted at PJP. Emails were sent on 5/21/25 to parents and students who do not currently have this dose on file.

Rising Juniors

A completed physical with updated vaccines (including dose 2 of MCV) is required in 11th grade. As your student gets the age 16 well-check OR a sports physical, please have a physical form (or copy of PIAA exam) completed and sent to nurse@pjphs.org.



Senior Reminder - Final Transcripts

Final Transcripts will be sent to the colleges and universities you listed on the *Final Transcript Request Form* (submitted via Google Forms earlier this spring). Transcripts will be ready to send once the school year officially ends for all students and PowerSchool finalizes the data.

Important: If your college plans have changed and you are now attending a different school than originally indicated, please notify the Guidance Office as soon as possible so we can ensure your transcript is sent to the correct institution.

Junior Parents - PARENT BRAG SHEET for Class of 2026 for Counselor's Letter of Recommendation

The PJP School Counselors request Junior parents/guardians to complete a Parent Brag Sheet for their child. Completion of this form is optional, but, during the College Application process, many colleges and/or scholarships require a Counselor Letter of Recommendation, and a parent/guardian's insight can provide invaluable information that is worth including in a Counselor Recommendation, conveying your child's unique qualities. This information will aid counselors in writing the individualized counselor letter of recommendation. This signed form authorizes the Guidance Department to send your official transcript and letters of recommendation to all colleges and scholarships when you start to apply next year. The Guidance Office would like to be preemptive and get this on file now, before the rush of next year's application cycle.
