


One School, One Book

Before they make their choices, students are encouraged to read reviews of the books so that they choose books that interest them. Parents are encouraged to help their children choose appropriate novels for their interests and abilities.

MATHEMATICS

The math department is thrilled with the performance and tenacity of our students.

To continue providing the best experience possible, the math department is encouraging all students that will be enrolled in Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, Precalculus or Calculus to participate in a Khan Academy summer math enrichment assignment called "Get Ready For". (AP Calculus and AP Precalculus students were given an alternate assignment.)

While not mandatory, participation will be of great value and is strongly encouraged that students complete the assignment. It will help students when facing challenges in their future math courses and to fill in any gaps that were created during the Covid pandemic and review all the necessary topics that they are expected to know.
