Academic Affairs

Earlier this spring, all returning 9th, 10th, and 11th grade students were asked to submit their course requests for the 2024-2025 academic year in PowerSchool. Please sign in to your PowerSchool parent portal to review and acknowledge the courses that your student selected. This <u>direction set</u> will guide you through the process. The 2023-2024 Academic Honors Convocation will be held on Wednesday, May 29th at 6:30 p.m. Students who are in the top 10% of their graduating class for all grade levels will be recognized, and there are some special recognitions awarded to members of the graduating class of 2024. Students receiving special recognition as well as those in the top 10% of their class and their families will receive more

information as the date approaches.



Final Exams are coming up! Senior Exams are scheduled for May 28th - 31st and underclass assessments are scheduled for June 6 - 10th. School policy does not permit students to take their assessments early, however, students may make arrangements with their teachers should they be absent on the dedicated exam day to take their assessments late or have an alternative assessment if the teacher allows that. Underclassmen who miss any exams during the dedicated exam periods may take their assessments on their closing class day. Arrangements for all any makeup exams must be made directly with the teacher. Testing is also available the week of June 17th - 21, however, students will receive incomplete grades for the year. Students who take late exams will receive an adjusted report card after their exam scores have been processed.

Senior exams are taken during the 1st and 2nd periods of the academic day.

Seniors will only report to school if they have an exam scheduled. If they do not have an exam scheduled, they will not report to school and they will be dismissed from school after their last exam for the day. Students are not permitted to remain in the building beyond 2nd period so that they do not disturb classes as usual for underclass students. Some teachers may utilize an alternative assessment rather than an exam, in which case students will not report to school. Arrangements for conflicts and/or make up exams must be made directly with the teacher.

Underclass Assessment Schedule

There is a special schedule for exam days. Students are only required to be in school for periods in which they have an exam scheduled. Sometimes teachers utilize alternative assessments (projects, research papers, etc) other than exams in which case your child may not have an exam for a particular exam period. Please be sure to check with your student to determine which classes they will need to report to school for on each exam day. Students who are in school and have an open exam period but will be remaining at school to await transportation will report to the cafeteria for a quiet study period. Dismissal will be at 11:30 a.m. on these days.

Q: We will be away on one of the exam days, can my student take their exams early?

A: The exam dates are published to the school calendar at the beginning of the year to avoid any conflicts. To protect the integrity of exams, students are not permitted to take exams early. At the teachers' discretion, an alternative assessment or alternate exam may be offered by special arrangement with the student. If no alternative assessment or alternative exam is available, the student must make the exam up at a later date. Exams completed by the end of term will be included in final grades, exams taken after the last day of school may produce an incomplete grade that will be corrected after the exam is scored and final grade processed.

Q: My student has only one exam on a particular day, when do they report and leave?

A: Students are only required to be in school for scheduled exams. If they have transportation to and from at the times specified on the exam schedule, they are expected to arrive 5 minutes prior to their exam and may leave when they are dismissed.

Q: My student rides the bus, but has only one exam on a particular day. Where will they report? A: Students who are in school and have an open exam period but have arrived early or will be remaining at school to await transportation will report to the cafeteria for a quiet study period.

Panther's Learning Center

With final exams approaching, students should begin preparing for the end of year by doing the following:

- · Check in with teachers about whether they will complete a test or project
- Identify what materials and resources they have for studying
- · Review Schoology and PowerSchool to ensure all assignments are submitted
- Check in with Mr. Rogers for additional support as needed.

The Panthers' Learning Center is available for students throughout the day, particularly after school when multiple teachers are present to assist students with their work.

Exams with Accommodations

Final exams will be taking place for seniors after Memorial Day and for students in grades 9, 10, and 11 on June 6, 7, and 10. Students with academic accommodation plans are welcome to take their midterm exams in the Panthers' Learning Center.

If your teacher is giving an exam and you would like to take it in the PLC, please email your teachers and then fill out this form using your PJP email address by Thursday, May 23 at noon

(<u>https://forms.gle/ftTiFMRTarJQwMUu5</u>) to indicate that you wish to take your tests with extended time in the PLC. This helps us in getting our space ready for you. Students in Panther Performance will do this in class.

For planning purposes, students are not permitted to make last-minute changes (deciding to take their test in

the classroom after signing up or signing up after the form deadline has passed).

Blue and Gold Day

Blue and Gold Day, Wednesday, May 22nd, is quickly approaching. Homerooms will be competing throughout the day starting and ending with a Pep Rally in the gym. Because of the nature of the competition in which they will be participating, students will be permitted to dress down. The dress code rules for this day are different from any other day. Please read the following dress code regulations carefully. TEN POINTS WILL BE AWARDED TO EACH HOMEROOM IF EVERYONE COMPLIES! Members of the BLUE TEAM must wear a BLUE T-shirt and GOLD TEAM members must wear a GOLD/YELLOW T-shirt. The shirts must have sleeves and they may be decorated to show your SCHOOL SPIRIT. Please avoid any inappropriate sayings or slogans. FOR BLUE AND GOLD DAY ONLY-- sweatpants, yoga pants/leggings, or athletic shorts/gym shorts may be worn. (They will not be permitted on future dress down days.) Athletic shorts must be as long as your fingertips when you hold your hands down by your side, and they should not have any writing on the back. Athletic shoes will suit you best for competition. All clothing must be whole—not ripped or torn.

The day will be warm and sunny, so don't forget your sunscreen. You may wear face paint on your cheeks only. Remember, the day will be warm and sunny, so think about whether painting your face is a good idea.

Senior

- College shirt day
 - As communicated earlier this month, College Acceptance Day has been postponed to Tuesday, May 21.
 - Since many colleges have pushed back their official Decision Day to either mid-May or June 1st due to this year's FAFSA delays and associated challenges, our College Shirt Day for seniors has been rescheduled from May 1st to May 21st as some of our students are waiting to make college decisions.
 - All seniors are to report to homeroom on Tuesday, May 21 at regular time (even if you have late arrival). After attendance, seniors are to report to the gym for the celebration of College

Acceptances. You are asked to wear the college shirt for the school you are attending that day along with sweatpants or jeans.

- NHS members are meeting at 7:15am for elections for officers for next year. Attendance will be taken at the meeting, the vote will take place, and then you will join the rest of the senior class in the gym.
- Once you arrive in the gym, you are asked to group yourselves by college for photos. We will first take a large group picture on the bleachers, then go outside for individual school pictures.

Monday Morning Arrival

The cafeteria will be used on Monday morning for the varsity athletes breakfast. Anyone who arrives to school prior to 7:40 and is not a varsity athlete will meet in the student Commons with Mr. Allen.

Development Update...Lights On...Race On Close to Completion

The "Lights On...Race On" campaign is close to completion. It has been a long road with a number of stops and starts. Below is a short summary of what has transpired over the last five plus years.

During the prior administration and board leadership, PJP unveiled plans to construct a Stadium at the current football field site. The renderings projected a total expense of \$1.8 million for the project. An official campaign was launched, accompanied by a planned event to rally support. However, the onset of COVID-19 abruptly halted progress on this initiative.

Once COVID-19 was over, a decision was made to reconvene with the architects and engineers to get updated pricing on the "stadium" project, recognizing the significant increase in the cost of goods and services in the post COVID world. This reassessment resulted in a revised cost of \$3.8 million for the construction of the proposed stadium.

Facing a number of challenges, PJP's Board opted to approach the project in stages. Stage 1, Completed in September 2021, involved the installation of a strategically positioned flagpole at the football field which is visible from all nearby athletic fields.

Stage 2: Launch a campaign for lights and bleachers on the east side of the field. However, due to concerns over the safety of the current track and PJP being in jeopardy of hosting track meets, the campaign shifted focus to replacing the track instead of installing bleachers.

Stage 3: PJP launched the "Lights on, Race On." campaign to raise \$610,000 to replace the existing track and install lights.

Stage 4: With sufficient funds raised for the track, a new track was installed in October 2022.

Stage 5: Since October of 2022, efforts have been focused on raising the remaining funds to install the lights. As of May 8, 2024, PJP is only \$25,000 short of the required amount. Once this sum is secured, the vendor is poised to commence the installation of the lights. Beginning the week of May 19th, some PJP athletic teams will launch a fundraising campaign with schoolfundr to raise the remaining funds for the lights and the initial funds for the bleachers.

Stage 6: Future plans involve the installation of bleachers on the east side of the field. Any surplus funds raised beyond the lighting project's requirements will be allocated towards this endeavor.

Bus Transportation for 2024-25 School Year

If your child requires transportation by bus for the upcoming 2024-2025 school year, please complete the steps below.

- 1. Complete the appropriate school district form. <u>Click here</u> to find the form for your local public school district. Please read the district instructions carefully, some require proof of residency.
- 2. Email a copy of your student's transportation form to transportation@pjphs.org by NO LATER THAN Friday, May 17, 2024.
- Please place the name of your school district in the subject line of your email.
- If mom and dad reside in separate school districts, two separate district forms need to be completed.
- The Student Services Office will provide each busing school district with a list of students requiring transportation and the forms. If the forms are not returned to PJP by Friday, May 17th, then you must follow submission instructions listed on the bottom of the form.

• Special note: The forms for Souderton, Owen J. Roberts School, Perkiomen Valley, and Great Valley School Districts are electronic and are automatically sent to these districts. If you reside in any of these districts, you may skip step 2.

Please be prompt in returning these forms. The forms will assist the districts in creating more accurate and timely bus schedules for the next school year. The district in which you reside will share the bus schedule with you a week or two before the school year begins.
