We are not permitted to hire a subject specific substitute for an absent teacher unless the leave is extended and the teacher's date of return is able to be identified.

Academic Affairs



The Office of Catholic Education now reports both the weighted and unweighted GPA on a 4.0 scale. The GPA for all returning students has been recalculated to reflect the new scale.

Panthers' Learning Center



Our goal in the Panthers' Learning Center is to position all students for academic success which is why we, along with guidance counselors and school leadership, check the grades of all students on a weekly basis as part of Academic Intervention.

Students who are failing two classes for the week will be asked to come to the Learning Center twice that week at lunch or after school to work on assignments and study for upcoming tests. Additionally, students failing one class and their families may receive an email notifying them of this and encouraging them to check their grades.

We understand that the grade report at any given time is simply a snapshot of grades and may not acutely reflect student performance (due to absences, extensions, or assignments waiting to be graded). It is important for us, however, to ensure that students and families are aware of grades to avoid any potential interruptions to activities and participation in summer school.

STUDENT HANDBOOK CHANGES FOR THE 2025-2026 SCHOOL YEAR

Our 2025-2026 student handbook is available on our school website under Student Services and with our electronic school forms on PowerSchool. All modifications for the 2025-20206 school year -have been highlighted and will be reviewed with

students during their class meetings at the beginning of the school year.



SCHOOL FORMS

All 2026-2026 school forms must be completed by both students and parents by Friday, September 12, 2025. Instructions were emailed to all families on Thursday, August 21, 2025.

TRANSPORTATION and EARLY DISMISSALS

There are several early dismissal days on our school calendar. All school districts provide transportation to school on early dismissal days, but not all school districts will provide transportation home.

PICK UP AND DROP OFF PROCEDURES

To maintain the safety of our school community PJP has established student Drop-Off and Pick-Up procedures. Please review these procedures here prior to the start of the school year if you plan on driving students to and from school daily.

We kindly request that parents refrain from parking in our parking spaces for a student drop-off or pick-up because this delays the students, faculty, and staff assigned to the spaces from entering the building. In addition, we request that all drivers maintain a 15 mph speed limit as they travel through the lot. Thank you in advance for following these protocols to keep our school community safe.



BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL HOURS

Students may arrive at school beginning at 7:00 am. Between 7:00 am and 7:40 am all students must report directly to the cafeteria where they are moderated. After 7:40 am all students may report to their locker and homeroom.

Students are permitted to remain after school to visit teachers, participate in scheduled activities, or for transportation. If necessary, students remaining at school after dismissal must report to the Panther's Learning Center (PLC) while waiting for their

extra curricular activity to begin or when waiting for a ride home. The PLC is designated for academic purposes and students must follow the specific protocols outlined under the Panthers' Learning Center. All students must be picked up by 4 pm unless participating in an extracurricular activity that begins later.



SCHOOL LUNCH ACCOUNTS

Lunch is available for all PJP students in the cafeteria. Students are permitted to pay in cash, however, if you are interested in signing up for a school lunch account please click here for additional details. You will need your child's

student number to establish an account. Student numbers are listed on the printed roster a student receives on their first day of school.



VISITOR POLICY

PJP utilizes the Raptor Technologies Visitor Management System to screen visitors and identify them as a risk. Each visitor is required to present a driver's license upon entry. A visitor's badge will be printed for them to wear throughout the building.



SCHOOL LOCKS

All students who are new to PJP will receive a school lock on the first day of the school year; this lock is to be used by the students for all four years. All locks placed on school lockers must be a school lock.

All returning PJP students must bring their lock to school upon their return in September.

Any student who does not have their school lock from last year must purchase a new one through the Student Services Office. The cost of a new lock is \$10 and used locks are \$5. This fee will be charged through FACTS.

All school lock combinations are on file in the Student Services Office for those who do not remember their combination.

All students must have their school lock on their locker by Friday, September 12th. After that date, locks will be placed on all lockers not in use.



ID CARDS

All students will be provided with two cards. One will be a student ID card with their photo specifying their class year. Students are expected to wear their student ID on a PJP lanyard as part of their school uniform. Freshman and transfer

students will receive a lanyard at the beginning of this year.

The second card is a building access card that must be kept with their student ID. Grades 10 - 12 will have their access card returned to them at the beginning of the year. A \$30 replacement fee will be charged to the FACTS account for any student who did not turn in their access card at the end of the year.

ID's and access cards will be collected at the end of the school year and will be returned again the following school year.

Students missing access cards must report it immediately. The fee for a replacement access card is \$30. The fee for the replacement of student ID's is \$5.



RESPONSIBLE USE OF TECHNOLOGY

At PJP, our students use technology on a regular basis to enhance their learning. School Chromebooks should be utilized for that purpose only and all students should adhere to the Responsible Use of Technology Policy outlined in our

Student Handbook.

As our students prepare for college and enter the workforce, we highly encourage our students to leave a positive digital footprint. Even when social media accounts are private, colleges and companies find ways of reviewing what individuals post. The book, <u>Light</u>, <u>Bright</u>, <u>and Polite</u>, by Josh Ochs educates students on how to use their social media accounts as a platform to present their strengths rather than a way to post criticisms.

Younger more inexperienced students have the tendency to misuse social media in an inappropriate manner. We encourage both students and parents to read Light Bright and Polite together so that students may create a positive digital identity.
